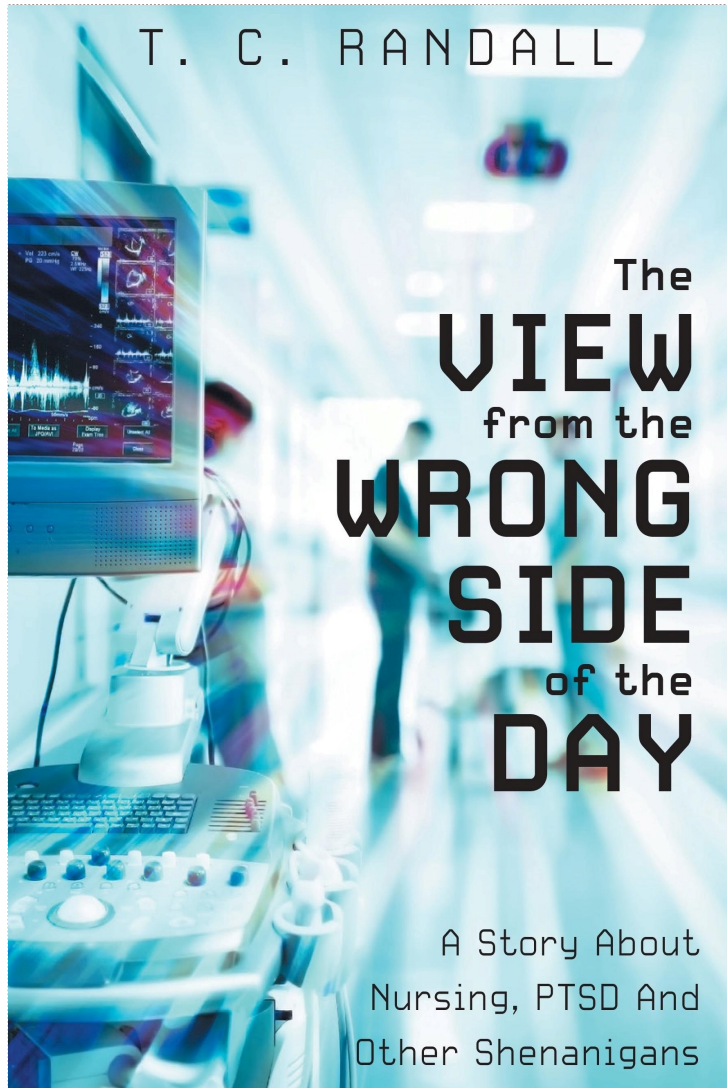


# The view from the Wrong Side of the Day

During the current pandemic, the strain on the system has only gotten worse, and many of the issues that are discussed in the book are now more relevant than ever.

The author also talks about what it is like to suffer with a mental illness, and how inadequate the current level of support for nurses is when they suffer an emotional injury on the job.
